Lent – time to refocus

We have barely packed away the crib at the end of Epiphany season when it is time to also pack away chocolates, alcohol, social media or whatever else it is that we might be fasting (giving up) during the Lent season. Lent starts on Ash Wednesday which this year is 14th February (Ashing will be offered at services at 10am in the Parish Centre and 7.30pm in Church).

The 40 days of Lent (not including Sundays) are a reminder of the wilderness times in the Bible: Jesus' 40 days being tempted in the wilderness, 40 days of rain for Noah as the world was washed clean, but also the 40 years the Israelites spent wandering the wilderness, unable to enter the Promised Land because they failed to trust that God would be with them.

The purpose of fasting things is, among other things, to focus our minds and to discipline ourselves. Much of the Christian life involves self-denial; we die to ourselves, in order to live a fuller more abundant life in Christ (Romans 6:5-7). When we have that desire to reach for a chocolate bar, or a hunger pang if we are fasting meals – those desires are meant to remind us to pray, and to ask for God's help to overcome the many different temptations we face in life. We do none of this in our own strength, we have to ask the Holy Spirit to fill us and strengthen us.

During Lent we also remember our sinfulness and our need for a Saviour. Unless we recognise just how fallen, frail and sinful we each are, we cannot grasp just how amazing the story of the cross is. God sent a Saviour in spite of everything we do, and while we were still entrenched in our sin, because of His great love for us. The good news is even better when we dare to remember how bad the bad news was.

So how will you use this Lent to draw closer to your loving God? You may want to give something up. You may want to join a small group, come to morning prayer on Mondays or join a prayer walk to spend some dedicated time focusing on God. Whatever you choose, my prayer is that you find blessing as you seek to know God better.



Parish Prayer Walking is Back

In preparation for Festival Teesside I am planning to walk every street in the Parish, praying for God's blessing on the homes, businesses and areas along each road.

The plan is to walk most Wednesdays 1-4pm. The starting point will vary.

The plan for the first few weeks is:

31st January – Marton Road, James Cook & Roseberry Park Hospitals (meet at Stewart Park gate on Marton crossroads)

7th Feb – Area around Sports Village/Rowan Park (meet at Stewart Park gate on Marton crossroads)

14th Feb – NO prayer walking

21st Feb – Area around Stewart Park (meet in Parish Centre car park)

28th Feb – Easterside north (meet at Marton Road end of Broadwell Road)

If you are not able to join me in person, please join me in spirit. You may want to download the Oikos Outreach app and join the Festival Teesside group. Then you can see a map of the area, and mark where you have prayed for, so we can all be encouraged as we see every street in Teesside prayed for in the run up to Festival Teesside (more info on Festival Teesside at www.festivalteesside.com).

Church in a Building



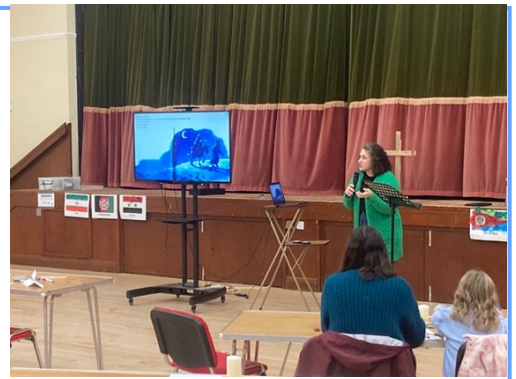
January has been a fun month at Church in a Building.

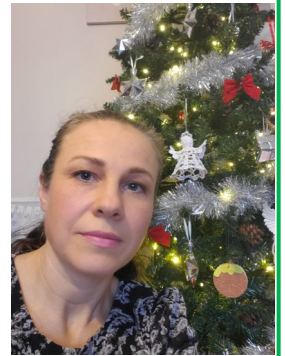


Mustard Seed

World Day of Prayer 2024

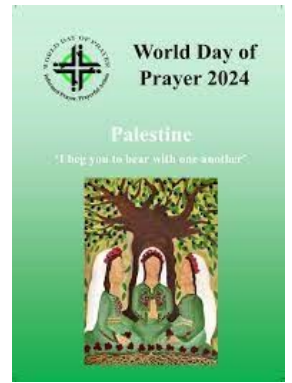
The churches of Marton and Nunthorpe invite you to a service at St Cuthbert's Church, Marton on Friday, 1st March 2024 at 2pm.

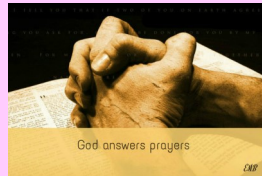

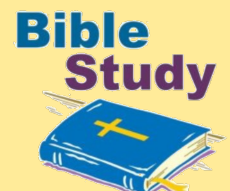

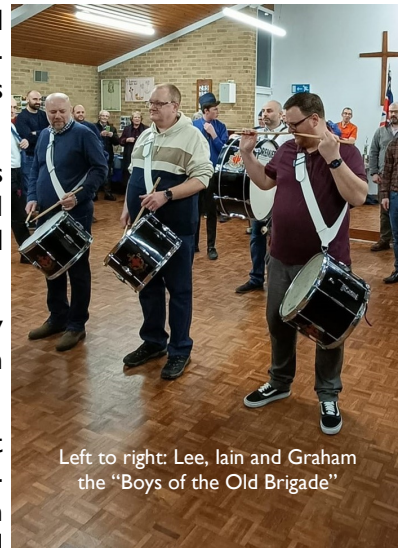

All three had been lead drummers in their time in the brigade and it was obvious from the demonstration that they had not lost their skills.

So pleasing also to see the original leaders and so many old boys, some had travelled many miles to be there. It raised a smile from me when the company was called to attention to see all those 40+ year olds jump to attention as if they were young boys again.
